They Avoid Video Calls



- *Trust yourself. If this happens — stop and step back.*

01 If someone always has an excuse why they “can’t” video chat bad connection, no camera, or emotional reasons that’s a red flag. Scammers often use stolen photos and can’t show their real face.

Reminder: Trust yourself — no genuine connection should hide behind a blank screen.

What To Do Page

- *If You Spot These Signs...*
 - *Don’t panic. Reassure yourself.*
 - *Cut off communication.*
 - *Report the profile.*
 - *Talk to someone you trust.*
 - *Reach out for support.*

They Fall in Love Too Fast

They Need Money (Even Just a Little)

It might start small they're stuck at the airport, they can't pay for Wi-Fi, or they have a sick family member. Once you send money once, they'll keep finding reasons.

Their Stories Don't Add Up

Look out for inconsistencies: time zones, work details, past relationships. Trust your gut if something feels off, it probably is.

They Push You to Keep It Secret

If they ask you not to tell friends or family, or warn you "others won't understand," that's manipulation. Healthy relationships don't need secrecy
